FLORIDA TRANSPORTATION DISADVANTAGED PROGRAMS MEDICAID SUPPORT

- Medicaid Transit demands are exceeding funding
- Good & Wheels
- Florida has unique human services transportation system
 - **Integrated Statewide**
 - Award Winning and Nationally Recognized
 - Serves entire disadvantaged community, medical, elderly, developmentally challenged
- The logical groupings of these otherwise dispersed individuals creates economies of scale and efficiency. The "System" provides better and more cost effective service for the entire State
- Benefits quantified most recently by the Marketing Institute of FSU's College of Business. (2007)
 - "TD" Program provides a \$8.35 payback on every dollar spent.
 - Medical trips \$11.08 payback (\$1.4 Billion)
- Key to long-term success of Florida TD System is local community/county oversight, customer service, and management
- Our needy citizens are currently receiving responsive, accessible, and accountable local service.
- Dissecting portions of the established "TD" Program for presumed "Stand-Alone" benefit, MUST CONSIDER THE DIS-ECONOMY OF SCALE IMPACT, as well as the huge loss in local funding, approximately 1\3 of system \$\$ (\$100 million)

WHY "CARVE OUT"

- Medicaid Non-Emergency Transit is an essential part of the TD Coordinated System
- Medicaid Transit already "reformed" (2005) One contract with TD Commission Monthly Cost Reduced and Capitated

CAN WE CARVE OUT MED TRANS?? Yes, because

- It's not medical, it's logistical.
- It is already in an essential, award winning, statewide, cost effective Transit System, that would be dismantled.
