♥ Lee County "Report Card"

- 1. Clients served—8,737 pregnant women and 1,854 infants in Lee County.
- 2. Administrative costs—remain at only 5%.
- 3. Pregnancy Risk Screening--92% of pregnant women in Lee agreed to complete the voluntary risk screen which was **better** than the state average of 87%.
- 4. Infant Risk Screening--89% of newborns were screened at the delivery hospitals which was **<u>better</u>** than the state average of 87%.
- 5. Infant mortality—the rate of babies that die within the first year of life has been increasing in recent years, but remains **better** than the state rate (5.9 per 1,000 births in Lee vs. the state rate of 7.2 in 2008).
- 6. Low Birth Weight--the percentage of babies born too small remains <u>better</u> than the state average (Lee 8.1% vs. Florida 8.8%.)
- 7. Fetal Deaths—the rate of stillbirths has been decreasing the last four years and is slightly **better** than the state average (Lee 7.0% vs. Florida 7.2%).
- 8. Access to Care—The percentage of pregnant women receiving prenatal care in the 3rd trimester or not at all continues to increase both locally and at the state level and nearly the <u>same</u> as the state average (Lee 5.9% vs. Florida 5.8%).
- 9. Uninsured—712 mothers who gave birth were uninsured and the rate is **better** than the state average (9.6% Lee vs. 10.7% FL).
- 10. Births to Teens 10-18 Years—Lee was 5.3% of 15-19 year olds which was worse than the state average of 4.2%.
- 11. Repeat Births to Teens—Lee was 20.9% which was worse than the state average of 18.3%.
- 12. Overweight Pregnant Women—Lee was 23.8% which was slightly worse than the state average of 22.8%.
