- 1. State Aid to Public Libraries (FY 2011-2012)
 - Request support for an increase in State Aid to Public Libraries State aid provides critical funding for public libraries to:
 - * Support Education and Reading
 - * Support Economic Development
 - * Support Government Services

State aid is distributed throughout Florida via formula grants administered by the Florida Department of State. The program requires a local match, which stimulates local support for public libraries.

- 2. Library Cooperative Grants (FY 2011-2012)
 - Support funding increase for Library Cooperative Grants. State grants provide critical funding for Florida's five Multitype Library Cooperatives (MLCs) to:
 - * Provide Continuing Education and Training for Library Staff
 - MLCs train over 9,000 library staff each year; in turn, the population is served and assisted in areas such as computer use and filing for government benefits. Market Value: \$1.2 million!
 - * Support Resource Sharing Between All Types of Libraries
 - ☑ MLCs help connect libraries through statewide interlibrary loan sharing more than 300,000 library items each year. Market Value: \$7.5 million!
 - MLCs coordinate Florida's statewide library delivery service moving over 450,000 library items annually. Market Savings over US Mail: \$790,000!
 - ☑ Floridians can find materials in all Florida Libraries because MLCs help libraries add their titles to the Florida catalog's 20 million items for Floridians to find and borrow.
