We (Community BH Leaders) urge you to support the following activities regarding the current Qualified Behavioral Health (substance use/mental health) workforce shortage. Nearly one in five persons has some type on behavioral health condition in the United States. And the disease burden of substance use/mental health was higher than for any other condition in 2015, Journal of the American Medical Association.

Collier and Lee Counties, including the United States/Florida are experiencing and will continue to experience a Qualified Behavioral Health workforce shortage.

It has been well documented that the workforce (psychiatrists, advanced nursing practitioners, addiction counselors, licensed mental health practitioners, peer support) shortage is occurring because of

- an aging out workforce
- low reimbursement rates
- low wages
- increase in military personnel seeking treatment in the private sector
- law enforcement is in process of hiring licensed and master level personnel
- schools are in process of hiring licensed and master level personnel
- increase opioid use
- more people are seeking substance use/ mental health treatment
- greater awareness of substance use/mental health conditions.

This impacts community based programs, criminal justice, emergency rooms, inpatient/outpatient, prevention, and schools. There is no quick fix to staffing shortages.

COVID has impacted the safety of delivering health care to all segments of the population. Many are feeling the economic impact.

- The workforce is subject to illness
- Individuals feel safer seeking assistance through telehealth
- There has been an increase in demand for behavioral health services

Legislative proposal:

- Offer a pilot program through the Master's program at FGCU (e.g. Kids' Minds Matter scholarship program offers \$5K to 20 graduate students over a year who are interested in working with kids.)
- Greater flexibilities for telehealth laws
- Improve student loan forgiveness programs for behavioral health (partial/full loan forgiveness for those serving underserved areas over a 3-5yr term).
- Increase rapid adoption of new and evolving practices and technologies
- Expand use of telehealth, it expands the workforce

FBHA Workforce Stats:

- Seventy-seven percent (77%) of Florida counties are underserved, and fifty-five percent (55%) have a "serious shortage" of child, adolescent and adult psychiatrists.
- With projected gaps in the psychiatrist workforce needed to meet demand expected to widen, additional mental health professionals will play an increasingly critical role in ensuring greater access to psychiatric care.
- Expanded use of additional providers who can release a Baker Act is a necessary strategy in the face of the declining number of psychiatrists per 100,000 populations at the national level. * this is in reference to making regulatory change to permit APRN's to 1. Examine a patient upon admission to a receiving facility AND 2. Approve a patient to be discharged from a receiving facility...if the facility is owned and operated by a nationally accredited community mental health center who receives state funding. (FBHA Survey Data)
